- 2022-2026 coalition (1st deputy-mayor, 5 councillors)










Local election results of Nový Jičín Green Party




Recycling kitchen waste

- In 2020 me organised so called "**Physical Waste Analysis**", e.g. had random bins poured on the square and analysed their content.
- We found out that the biggest recyclable constituent was kitchen waste
- We therefore looked for ways how to recycle it
- We found a bio-gas plant where they were able to process the waste
- Waste is turned there into electricity, heat and biogas
- Now we have 60 brown bins for kitchen waste placed around the town which are disposed once a week
- People quickly got used to it
- Former concerns about smell or mess around the bins luckily weren't confirmed
- It is still a bit more costly than dumping the waste but the balance might turn soon as dumping is becoming more expensive

100% Electric Public Transport

- Introduced in 2018
- We were 2nd city in Czechia with municipal buses run 100 % on electricity
- The buses are owned by a private company Arriva who won the competition for providing the service for the city
- Our municipal transport is relatively small: we have 3 buses and 4 city lines
- Advantages: ecology, smooth ride, popularity among people

Community Garden

- Community gardens are rather in bigger cities in Czechia
- However, in 2018, we had a piece of unused land near housing estates where used to be then vacant school gardens
- We organised a public meeting where we discussed 3 options how to use the area: 1) **community gardens**, 2) a **small park**, 3) a **car park**
- Luckily, a few people were willing to take part in community gardening
- We asked them to create an **association** (they called themselves "Long Grass") and gave them a little money for the start
- Positive effects: opportunity to grow crops, local compost, cultural events, chance for people to get to know each other




Planting trees in historical centres

- Our square is historical and beautiful: it has arcades all around
- The middle area **becomes pretty hot** in the summer, though, since there is **no shade**
- We therefore wanted to plant some trees there
- Since our town is a **Urban Conservation Zone**, we needed to get a permission from **National Heritage Institute** but for many years they disagreed
- Eventually we managed to persuade them by: 1) willing to compromise (less trees), 2) we found old pictures from 1920s when there used to be trees and 3) it was one of outputs of our Adaptation Strategy for Climate Change
- The trees should be planted this Autumn special Soil Cell
 System will be used to keep the trees healthy
